

- Content related coordination is necessary between Bachelor and Master studies and individual courses.
- A better quality assurance system for teaching must be developed.
- ♦ Interest for courses in English language is very low among students, but according to graduate's survey of great importance for their working life.
- Strengthen intercultural learning and communication in individual courses and study programmes.
- Permeability of study programmes (A lot of applications for admission from Germany; study programmes of applied universities).










Bachelor Forestry Students in the first year








◆ One and a half years after graduation - without further training - 74-81% BOKU graduates are employed full-time or for an unlimited period.




- ♦ Six months after graduation the employment rate is more than 95%.
